



Former house of ENGINE 29 and the Deering police district statrormer nouse of EMSINE 29 and the Deering police district station located at 744 W. 35 TH Street in the section of Deering, that was razed in 1920. ENG 29 remained here in an old horse barn on the back lot until new house was finished at 3509 S. Lewe Avenue, and occupied it on May 19, 1925. ( John McIntre cellection )

ENG 13 (TOF) 209 N. Dearborn Organized here in the early 1880's and still in operation.

ENG 21 (UPPER LEFT) 14 W. Taylor St This was location of first Negro company in Chicago.

END 104 (Lower Left) 1403 S. Michigan Note carefully the drop harness just inside door up near ceiling, and cross chains along open doors to keep horees from running out in the street before being hitched on an alarm of fire.

Altho still in operation from this old
house which was built in 1852 making
it the oldest house still in existance
in the C.F.D., it has seen many changes. In its history it withstood the
Great Fire of 1871, and it served as
quarters of ENG 94 at the time of
the CB&Q fire of which 94 was first
due.

ENG 40 - TRK 6 117 N. Franklin St Still in operation in the Loop even though IBT next door has offered to build them a firehouse with the first three floors of a building they want to build on that site. Squad 1 is now also quarteded here.



ENG 96 - TRK 29

The former Town Hall of the Town of CICERO, this building has served as quarters for these companies since 1904. If you observe carefully above the words, FIRE DEPARTMENT, above the door, you may posibly still see where it had said, CICERO Folice & Fire Department. Another former house of CICERO township still remains within the corporate limits. tewnship still remains within the corporate limits of what is now called Oak Park, at Lake & Harvey. Truck 29 joined Eng 96 here on July 31, 1905.



ENG 107 - TRK 12 2258 W. 13 TH St Two separate buildings but considered one house, the Truck originally housed in three story, and later when 107 came they occupied a newer building to the east of the three story.



A company of which, since organization has seen some of cities worst disasters in their First-due district. HP 4 was quartered here for some mears.

ENG 12 1641 W. Lake S Located here next to former police 1641 W. Lake St station, the company awaits the okey to move, and the house wwaits the wreckers hammer.
